

PATIENT COUNSELLING INFORMATION

Vitamin B-Complex Syrup Mapratone[®]

Read the entire leaflet carefully before you start taking this medicine:

- If you have any further questions, ask your doctor.
- This medicine has been prescribed for you. Do not pass it on to others. It may harm them, even if their symptoms are the same as yours.
- If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet.

1. What is Mapratone[®] and what is it used for?

Mapratone[®] contains the following active ingredients: Thiamine hydrochloride, Riboflavin sodium phosphate, Pyridoxine hydrochloride, Niacinamide, D-Panthenol, Cyanocobalamin which are all classed as vitamin B substances.

Mapratone[®] is indicated in the treatment of vitamin deficiency states.

You should ask your doctor if you are unsure why you have been given this medicine.

2. What you need to know before you take Mapratone[®]?

Do not take Mapratone[®] if you are allergic (hypersensitive) to Thiamine hydrochloride, Riboflavin sodium phosphate, Pyridoxine hydrochloride, Niacinamide, D-Panthenol, Cyanocobalamin or any other ingredients of this medicine.

Other medicines and Mapratone[®]

Please tell your doctor if you are taking or have recently taken any other medicines, especially levodopa (for Parkinson's disease) or medicines obtained without a prescription.

Pregnancy, breast-feeding and fertility

If you are pregnant, planning to become pregnant or are breast-feeding, speak to your doctor before taking this medicine. It is important that you tell your doctor/ pharmacist if you are breast-feeding as you may need a lower dosage of this medicine.

3. How to take Mapratone[®]?

Always take Mapratone[®] exactly as your doctor has told you. If you are not sure, check with your doctor.

If you take more Mapratone[®] than you should

Taking more than the recommended dose is unlikely to cause any problems. If you are concerned about an overdose you should consult your doctor, if possible you should take the container with you.

If you forget to take Mapratone[®]

Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose. If you forget to take a dose, take it as soon as you remember it and then take the next dose at the right time.

4. What are the possible side effects of Mapratone[®]?

All medicines can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. Occasional side-effects include nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, rash, etc. If you think that you may have experienced a severe side effect then discontinue use and seek the advice of your doctor.

5. How to store Mapratone[®]?

Do not take this medicine after the expiry date shown on the pack. The expiry date refers to the last day of that month.

Store in a cool & dark place.

Keep out of reach of children.

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
